

#### From the Pastor's Desk

On Tuesday of this week I had an opportunity to attend the press conference of a group of pastors on the steps of the State Capitol. It was interesting to hear prepared statements from the leaders of a variety of religious communities or their delegates. Archbishop Nienstedt was present and spoke, and so did ministers and pastors from the Protestant communities – some kinds of Christians I had not known before. Several Orthodox priests were also at the event. The topic? The press conference was about the marriage amendment. Members of the media heard from a group of religious leaders (the "Ecumenical Fellowship in Defense of Marriage") who did not flinch or apologize as they spoke in support of the proposed amendment to the Minnesota Constitution that would define marriage only as the union of one man and one woman. The African-American pastors were especially impressive in their numbers and in their words. Having walked up to the steps after the event had already begun, I was a spectator only, but when that phase of the morning ended and the group of pastors began to disperse, I could see that there were several Catholic priests who had come to an event that was not heavily promoted.

After the press conference outdoors, we were invited into the Capitol for a meeting about what we could do in our churches to encourage parishioners to vote for the amendment. This leads me to mention the difference between endorsing a candidate or political party, which for a tax-exempt organization is not allowed by Internal Revenue Service, and advocating for a ballot initiative, which is allowed. Sometimes people do not understand this. In late August, the writer of a letter to the editor indignantly demanded, "Please tell me how the Catholic Church can maintain its tax-exempt status given its heavy involvement with the marriage amendment... I know the tax code is complicated, but one guiding principle should be that tax-exempt organizations should not work to support or defeat legislation or candidates." The writer gets it half right, in that churches cannot support a candidate. But even though the letter writer is mistaken about issue advocacy, I hope you know that we as a community of faith must be able to work together to promote an amendment to the Constitution that will protect marriage as the union of one man and one woman.

I heard a statement that drew spontaneous applause at the ecumenical meeting: the marriage amendment is not about the donkey or the elephant; it's about the Lamb. It's true. This is not a matter of the Democratic Party or the Republican Party. It's a matter of faith in Jesus Christ,

who is the Lamb of God and who took the Church as his Bride. This ancient language is drawn from the Book of Revelation, and it describes Christ's relationship with the Church in terms anyone could understand: it is a nuptial relationship, a marital union. We who are Jesus' disciples should not fear to say that we believe marriage should be protected. And how exactly is it threatened? This is how: what proponents of a change are advocating is not that same-sex marriage be set up alongside traditional marriage and be allowed to exist as a different form of marriage. No, they want to change the definition of marriage – broadening it so that it will include not only unions of a man and a woman, but also of two women or two men. The unique status of marriage would then be lost, since it would include other kinds of relationships besides the union of one man and one woman. Those who are opposed to the Catholic Church's teaching on marriage portray this as a question of discrimination against people whose attraction is to members of the same sex. That is an emotional ploy. No one's rights would be taken away if the amendment passes and marriage is defined as the union of one man and one woman. But without the amendment, a single judge with the right case could change the definition of marriage and take away the right to marry as we have always understood it.

How do things look for the ballot question we face in November? We can be cautiously optimistic. An outside poll shows that 52% are in favor of the amendment defining marriage as the union of one man and one woman, and 37% are against the amendment. That is consistent with Minnesota for Marriage's internal polls. That looks good, since many of those who say they are undecided in telephone polls simply don't want to say they are in favor of the amendment, meaning that more people will end up voting to approve it. I hope you will remember that there is no possibility of being neutral when it comes to the marriage amendment. It will pass only if a majority of votes cast in the election are "yes" votes. That's not a majority of responses to that question, but a majority of all votes cast. A proposed amendment can achieve more "yes" than "no" votes, but still fail if the number of "yes" votes is not a majority of all votes cast. If 1000 people vote in the whole election, and 400 vote "yes," 300 skip the question, and 300 vote "no," the measure fails because at least 501 votes cast in the election have to be "yes" to amend the Constitution. So skipping the question about the marriage amendment - leaving it blank - is the same as voting "no." Please don't forget that! I intend to support this amendment, and I hope you will bring into the voting booth what your faith teaches is true about marriage.


