## A Different Path

Born just before the American revolution, Elizabeth Ann Seton grew up to make history of her own. She was the first native-born American to be canonized.

Elizabeth was happily married and helping her husband with his family business when he fell very ill. Hoping to cure him, they went to Italy. He died there. Elizabeth, far from her home and family, found such great comfort in God and in the Blessed Virgin that she joined the Catholic Church. She returned to America. She started the first free Catholic school in her young country and also founded two orphanages.
