

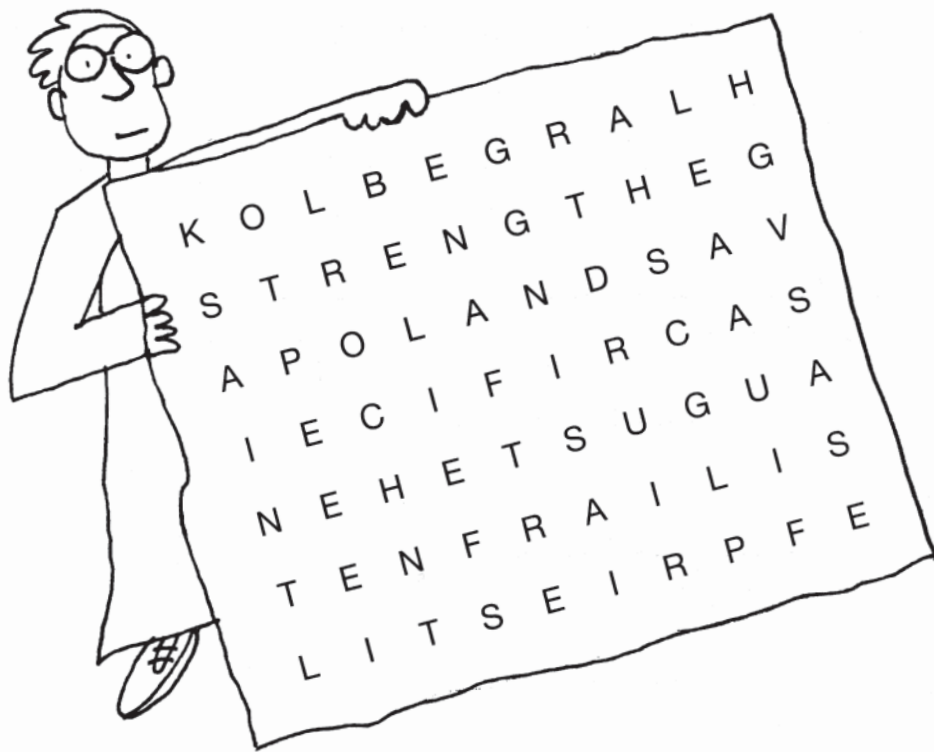
St. Maximilian Kolbe (1894-1941)

A Man of Strength and Courage

St. Maximilian Kolbe was a frail man who is remembered for the strength of his beliefs. A Franciscan priest, he started large monasteries in Poland, his native land, and in Japan. He returned to Poland just as World War II was about to break out. There, he was arrested by the Nazis, who had invaded his country and wanted to eliminate all religious leadership, along with all the Jews of Poland. They imprisoned Maximilian Kolbe in a concentration camp. When one prisoner there escaped, the Nazis chose ten men to execute as punishment. Among them was a young father. St. Maximilian Kolbe offered to die in the man's place, and he was murdered by the Nazis two weeks later.
