### CATECHISM CORNER



In this week's Gospel, we hear the story of a blind man who calls out to Jesus for healing. Does the Catechism of the Catholic Church have anything to say about this?

#### Catechism Corner

Paragraphs 2615 - 2616 (in Part Four, which focuses on Christian prayer) tell us that Jesus both hears and answers our prayers. Even while he was still in the midst of his ministry, the Lord responded to prayers of faith-filled people with powerful signs. When we pray with faith, Christ can and does respond, according to the truest good of our souls.

Our prayers can have effect because of our union with Christ and His with the Father. In faith we make our prayer through Jesus in his high priesthood, with Jesus in his headship over us and to Jesus by virtue of his Godhead.

In a prayer known as the *Jesus Prayer*, we can echo the urgency, trust and reliance on God by saying: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner!"

[In subsequent bulletins, this column will contain a very short synthesis of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, with some help from the Compendium to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, on one of a variety of topics, and how we can begin to understand that teaching. If you are unfamiliar with it, the Catechism (CCC, going forward) is a more or less comprehensive compilation of the Church's teaching, and is designed to be used as a sort of encyclopedia of doctrine, using the Apostles' Creed as an outline.]
