

From the Pastor's Desk

What an effort has been made by so many people! As I write this article, we are halfway through our series of four identical meetings about our parish's finances and all we will need to accomplish in the coming months. While the presentations consist of the same information given by different members of the parish, the question and comment period has varied strikingly. We can all look forward to the time in the near future when some of the leaders of the parish and I can present data that you have requested, offer clarifications, and answer questions that you have either asked out loud or in writing. I am very grateful to the many, many people who have attended these meetings, and to the planning committee members who have worked very hard to determine what people should know to make a decision about the good of the parish. Several of our staff have devoted a huge amount of time compiling data, and I thank them as well.

I want to take a moment to reflect on an aspect of parish life that would be easier to ignore. When statistics about financial support are listed in a table, or when Mass attendance is discussed or published, we can often adopt an attitude of blaming. The same thing often happens when people observe who is serving on committees or doing the work at this or that event. It also happens when we have to plead for teachers or catechists for our parish programs. We can think about which people are not pulling their weight, and make judgments against them.

For example, it can be startling to realize what a small percentage of Catholics attend Mass regularly, in our parish or anywhere. The Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) says the percentage of U.S. Catholics who in self-administered responses say they attended Mass once a week or more grew from 22% in 2000 to 23% in 2005 to 24% in 2012. Gallup reports a much higher percentage than CARA (45%), likely because Gallup's polling is conducted by telephone and people tend to over-report their own behavior when it's something they consider socially desirable. CARA uses some kind of fancy statistical method to estimate that in any given week, 31.4% of Catholics attend Mass.

We live among people who are Catholic only culturally, or who come to Mass only rarely yet have affection for the Church, or who are angry because they were mistreated by a priest or someone else and won't come to church, or who just don't think worshiping God at Mass is a good use of their time. Now of course I believe that deliberately missing Mass on a Sunday or holy day of obligation is a sin. In fact, for someone who has full knowledge that it is wrong and full consent of the will, missing Sunday Mass

is a mortal sin and will keep an unrepentant person from eternal life with God. (And yet many people do NOT have full knowledge because they simply do not believe that there is anything wrong with certain sins even if those sins involve grave matter.) So when we believe that it's harmful to people's souls to stay away from Mass, we ought to do something about it. If we like coming to Mass it's only natural to tell other people about it and invite them. But since it involves salvation, we should make sure we are inviting people to come to Mass! It would be easier if there were some program we could start that would get people back to church. But no such program will work without individual parishioners inviting their neighbors or relatives to return.

I have come to believe that in general about a third of Catholics come to Mass weekly, a third come only occasionally (probably for Christmas and in some cases for Easter, too), and a third never come to church for any reason. That last group might come to someone else's wedding or funeral, but their own funeral would not be in church, and their wedding certainly would not be a Catholic one. But do you know what? They still remain registered. They are given opportunities every year to tell us they don't want to be considered members. They receive packets of envelopes regularly. They get our parish newsletter and always know how they can call to tell us to stop sending mail to them. But for some reason they want to remain members. If they were admitted to a hospital, can you guess what they would say when asked about their religion? They would say they are Catholic! Everyone should know that anyone who is baptized a Catholic or who is later received into the full communion of the Catholic Church will always remain so. The Catholic Church always considers her sons and daughters to be part of the Body of Christ, and specifically to be united in the communion of the Catholic Church. This is true even if a Catholic begins to practice some other faith. But without a doubt a Catholic who doesn't go to Mass still remains a Catholic. Let's work together to get them back. Try telling them about how good it is to be a Catholic, and how good it is to be part of this community of faith, St. Peter's.

It was great to have a personal announcement from one of the leaders of Faithful Shepherd's SeptemberFest last week! I hope you will join me there next weekend. The concert on Saturday night, September 22 is sure to be memorable. The grounds open for the evening at 5:30 and Hairball finishes the concert at 11:00. For those who don't know the location, all of SeptemberFest takes place behind our school, which is at 3355 Columbia Drive in Eagan. That's along Yankee Doodle Road a mile and half east of 35E, across from the new fire station. See you there!






