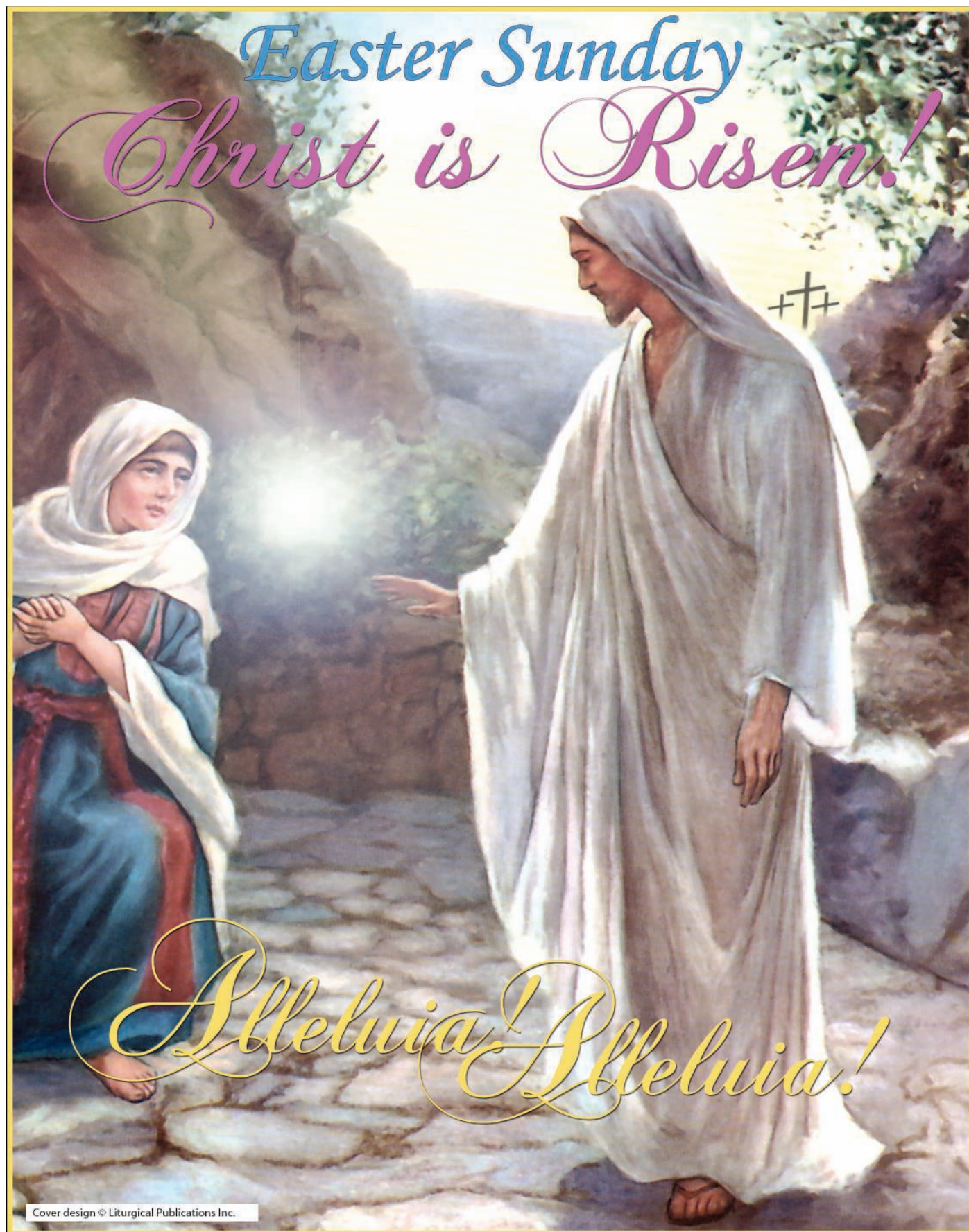

My dear friends,

With all my heart, I wish you and your families a blessed Easter day, filled with joyful “Alleluias,” as we celebrate, once again, the Gift of salvation through our Lord, Jesus Christ.

It’s wonderful how our celebration of the Resurrection in the Easter Season coincides with the Season of Spring, at least for those fortunate enough to live in the northern hemisphere. When the snow melts, we feel less confined. The warmer weather lifts our spirits. We are glad we have survived another Minnesota winter. All around us nature is waking up from its winter sleep to begin another cycle of new life and new beginnings. Brown fields quickly give way to green meadows.
