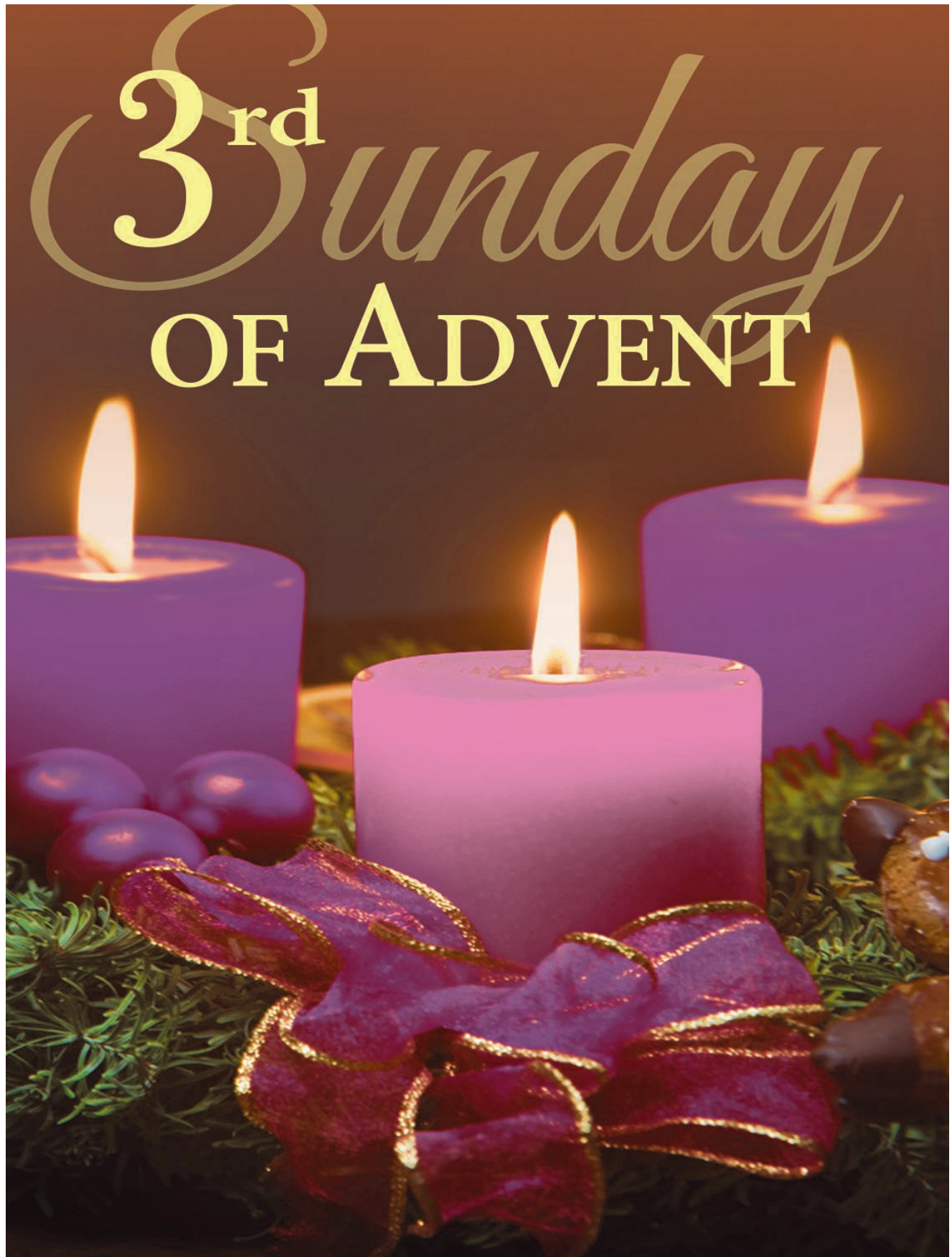

Reflections from our Music/Liturgy Director

Every so often, we enjoy something so much, we begin to refer to it as our “favorite”. As kids it could be colors, toys, or television shows. Perhaps later in life it would be songs, food, or movies. Later still it might be meals, but not necessarily in a general sense, but rather a specific meal on a particular occasion. Though we may not say it out loud, we may also consider a person our favorite to be around.

When my children ask me what my favorite color is, I really have no answer, each is breathtaking based on context. When they ask what my favorite food is, I might give an answer, but again context is the basis of my response. If I am asked about my favorite movie, I likely have an answer, but since my children have no experience of that movie, all I’m giving them is a further mystery. In fact, in the case of one favorite movie (*Inside-Out*), they have seen and enjoyed it, but I daresay none of them would understand my reasoning.

In my line of work, or even merely as a musician, I don’t really have the luxury of claiming any one song or composer as my favorite. And if I were to declare a favorite, there would be an unspoken expectation that I justify my choice to a peer. The other dodgy thing about playing “favorites” is that those tastes evolve constantly, as do our experiences of new things and new contexts.

As we grow and mature, our enjoyment, or reverence, if you will, for something is more and more a function of the context in which we experience it. For instance, my favorite songs right now are the kind wherein we sing the name of Jesus, either together in a corporate setting, or alone in my personal prayer time. There is more than just “something about that name” or the act of singing it. As many hymns or songs have stated before, there’s power in the name of Jesus.

The story of Peter and John on the way to the temple exemplifies this: as they walked they came across a crippled beggar and offered him what they had, which was nothing at all like what he wanted or expected in that moment. Peter said, “I have neither silver nor gold, but what I have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, rise and walk.” (Acts 3:6) The man’s ensuing celebration brought a lot of attention and led to both a night in prison and an appearance before the Sanhedrin for the three of them.

When asked in what name such a thing had been done (in essence, who gave you authority to do such a thing or who sent you?), Peter gives us this testimony of faith in the Divine power of the holy name of Jesus: “There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved.” (Acts 4:12)

We also profess each week that it is through him that we, among “all things,” were created. In other words, through Jesus everything that is came into being. If that doesn’t demonstrate power, we may need to examine our criteria of what constitutes power.

The allure of power, or wielding it, is not the basis of my current love of singing Jesus’ name, however. When we sing his name with reverence, sweetness, devotion, and affection in our hearts for the Lord our God, we may notice the “temperature” in the room changes. The very atmosphere bends at the Name, creating a moment, an opportunity to reach into the secret places of the heart and find Him dwelling there. When we sing, “Jesus,” we transcend the earthly and meet with the heavenly.

The other favorite I want to mention is this Sunday, traditionally known as “Gaudete Sunday,” a day on which we rejoice at the nearness of our salvation. In Advent we “prepare a highway” for God in a way that acknowledges the truly imminent and undeniable fact that the redemption of our humanity has and will come. This is what the very feast of Christmas celebrates, the Incarnation.

This is a day to anticipate, in the midst of the work of preparation, that Jesus has and will come to each. If we prepare well, the renewal of faith, hope, and love could be the greatest gifts available this season.
