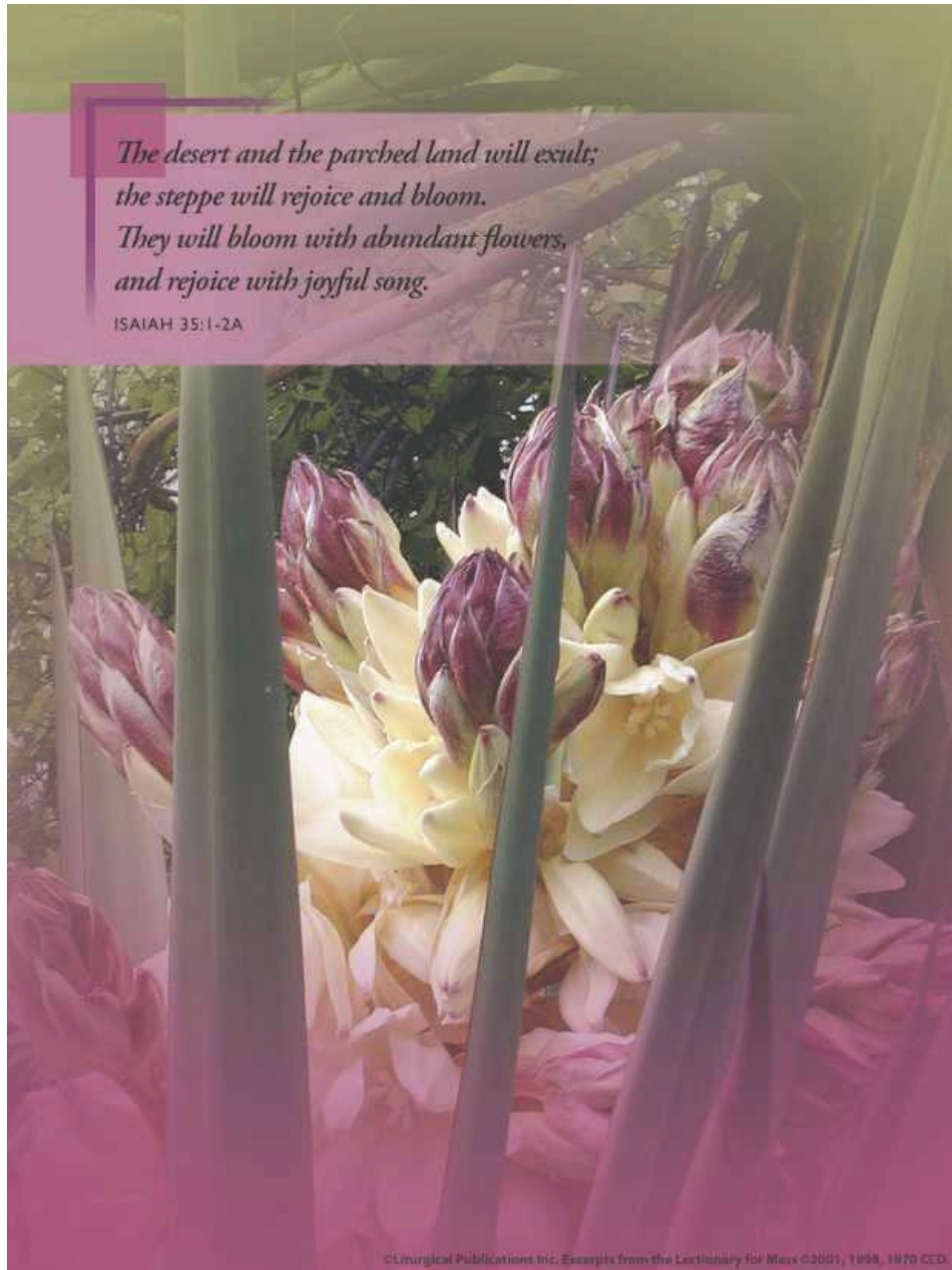

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Third Sunday of Advent

From the Pastor's Desk

This past Monday an event seen only rarely took place in our own Cathedral of St. Paul: a new bishop was ordained. Bishop Andrew Cozzens will serve our Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis as a second auxiliary bishop, carrying out many of the same duties, I presume, that Bishop Lee Piché is already performing. It was a memorable celebration this week, and I will explain what took place a bit later.

We are not always fortunate enough to have two auxiliary bishops at the same time. For a brief time beginning in 1989 we had three: Bishops J. Richard Ham, Robert Carlson, and Joseph Charron. Auxiliary bishops are moved or retire, though, so by 1991 we had Bishops Robert Carlson and Lawrence Welsh. Bishop Carlson moved to Sioux Falls in 1994, and in 1999 Bishop Welsh died. Later in 1999 Bishop Frederick Campbell was ordained, and served here until he went to Columbus in 2004. Bishop Richard Pates was ordained in 2000, and was here as auxiliary bishop until he went to Des Moines in 2008. Bishop Lee Piché was ordained in May 2009, and until Monday was Archbishop Nienstedt's only auxiliary bishop. We were given the great gift of another bishop by Pope Francis because of the growing need here for a bishop who speaks fluent Spanish. More of our Catholics in this Archdiocese are Spanish-speaking, and having a bishop who can speak to them easily in their mother tongue is a great benefit, and an additional sign of the Church's pastoral care for all people.

The ordination of Bishop Andrew Cozzens is not something about which I can be impartial. He is my classmate from the seminary. It might help to give you some idea about what this means. In college my class had about 1,800 members. I graduated and three months later moved into the St. Paul Seminary to find myself in a class of 12 people! That included the men from other dioceses who had come to St. Paul for seminary. By the time we were ordained in 1997 we were seven men seated before Archbishop Flynn. We had had almost all of our classes together. We had had meals together. We had worshiped together. We had prayed morning or evening prayer together. We had traveled to the Holy Land and lived in Jerusalem for three months together. We knew how to push each other's buttons, and we knew all of the inside jokes that required only a few words to bring back entire humorous situations. What I am trying to communicate is that I know Bishop Cozzens very well. Sixteen years have passed and long ago he went off to get a doctorate and has been teaching at the seminary. But the same great history remains intact.

This new bishop was one of the first people I met on my first day at the seminary. As most of the members of our seminary class traveled through Europe en route to Israel for our semester in Jerusalem in 1995, we were at times all together and at times in separate groups. Bishop Cozzens and I spent quite a few days together, first in Paris as we journeyed to Rome and in then on a trip-within-a-trip to northern Italy and Switzerland. I will never forget those times! I can assure you that we have a new bishop who is a wonderful human being, and whom you will love if you have any encounters with him at all. For me to sit in that congregation at the Cathedral of St. Paul and watch someone I know so well be ordained a bishop is something special. According to last year's statistics, there are only 5,104 bishops in the entire world, and now my classmate has been added to that list of the successors of the apostles. I do not say this lightly: I am filled with joy.

During the ordination rite, the ordaining bishop (Archbishop Nienstedt) has to ask whether there is a mandate from the Apostolic See. Only the pope can authorize the ordination of a new bishop; without a mandate from the pope, all of the bishops involved in an illicit ordination would face a severe penalty. So the mandate is read out loud so that the entire congregation can hear it. Using the very old custom of writing in the plural, Pope Francis wrote that "We turned Our attention to the North Star State" and decided to call "Our beloved brother" to be a bishop. It was a heartwarming moment. Bishop-elect Cozzens was asked nine questions about his intentions, such as, "Do you resolve as a good shepherd to seek out the sheep who stray and gather them into the Lord's fold?" Each question is answered with, "I do," except for the last, when the reply is, "I do, with the help of God." Then the bishop-elect prostrates himself on the floor while we all kneel and sing the Litany of the Saints. Then at last comes the laying on of hands and the Prayer of Ordination, prayed with the Book of Gospels held open over the candidate's head. At this moment the man becomes a bishop. This truth is explained ritually in the minutes that follow, as the head of Bishop Cozzens is anointed with chrism, and as he is presented with the Book of Gospels, a ring, a miter, and a crosier, or pastoral staff.

At the end of the Mass, the new bishop, wearing the miter on his head and carrying the crosier, stood in the pulpit and addressed us all with humility and reverence. After beginning with the single word "Wow," Bishop Cozzens referred to these difficult times for the Catholic Church in this Archdiocese. He said there is only one way to respond to evil: "you and I have to be holy." That was his message. Oh, let us try together to grow closer to God—to grow in holiness—as we continue through Advent toward Christmas!
