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From the Pastor's Desk

This is the bulletin for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, but many of you might be reading it for the first time on Monday or Tuesday – Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. So even if the greetings are a little early for some of you, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you a merry and blessed Christmas! But before I go any further with Christmas greetings, I want to mention Advent.

Occasionally I compare the former and current version of the prayers we use at Mass. I am so grateful we now have more accessible to us the richness of the prayer tradition of the Church! The old version was more of a free-form translation of ideas, while the new version translates the actual words. That change a little more than a year ago has given us back something wonderful. One of the prayers from the Third Sunday of Advent illustrates this change nicely:

Opening Prayer (then):

“Lord God, may we, your people, who look forward to the birthday of Christ experience the joy of salvation and celebrate that feast with love and thanksgiving.”

Collect (now):

“O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord’s Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing.”

We are asking the Heavenly Father to enable us to attain the joys of salvation, and to celebrate those joys “with solemn worship and glad rejoicing.” I am so glad that what had been referred to as merely looking forward to Christ’s birthday is now described as faithfully awaiting the feast of the Lord’s Nativity.

So now I would like to extend my Christmas greetings to all of you! St. Peter’s has some families whose presence here goes far back into history. To all who are here because you are back with your natural family, please know we are glad to have you here. I’d also like to welcome those who are visiting us because you live nearby and have not yet found a parish home. We would like it so much if you began to worship here regularly. To those who already do make this their place of worship, faithfully gathering Sunday after Sunday to worship on the Lord’s Day, I extend special greetings. It gives me great joy to be with all of you at one of the high points of the Church year.

To those who only come to be with us on the feasts most central to our faith, I am pleased you are here! All of those who are here every week, including your pastor, often fall

and need God’s grace to get back up again. Although we haven’t yet arrived at the place to which God is calling us, we are people who are on the way, and would love for you to accompany us.

No matter how often we see you, we would love for you to have a copy of the book *Rediscover Catholicism: A Spiritual Guide to Living with Passion and Purpose* as the Catholic Church’s gift to you. We hope that it will reignite the faith of many people!

In a few days the church will be beautifully transformed by the decorations that will be present for the whole Season of Christmas. I want to thank those who will work so hard to decorate both the Main Church and the Historic Church for Christmas. And I would like to thank the instrumentalists, the members of our choir, and our music director David Dunst, for the tremendous effort you have made to enhance our worship with song. What would we do without our sacristans and ushers? Your work also takes dedication, as do the contributions of our lectors and altar servers. Thanks to you all! This is one of those times that I specifically thank the rest of the parish staff as well. You all do so much to make it easier for our parishioners to worship God and learn about the faith we hold in common. I am grateful to you for your contributions, especially because ours is not a large staff and everyone has many responsibilities. Members of the parish, you can find inserted in the bulletin a Christmas greeting signed by all of the staff.

On Christmas Day and Easter Sunday, the popes through the years have given an address from the central balcony of the Basilica of St. Peter in the Vatican. It is addressed *Urbi et Orbi* – that is, “To the City and to the World.” This is a small part of Pope Benedict’s greeting on Christmas Day 2011.

Let us turn our gaze anew to the grotto of Bethlehem. The Child whom we contemplate is our salvation! He has brought to the world a universal message of reconciliation and peace. Let us open our hearts to him; let us receive him into our lives. Once more let us say to him, with joy and confidence: “*Veni ad salvandum nos!*” [*Come to save us!*]
