From the Pastor's Desk

Iwish you a blessed Christmas! Today is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, which is the Sunday between Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. On this day every year (it is observed on December 30 even if no Sunday falls between those two great feasts) we pause in the midst of the Season of Christmas to consider the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We ask for the prayers of Our Lady and St. Joseph, and we ask the blessing of Jesus.

I want to share a few thoughts about the best-known Christmas Mass time. Do you remember when there was no such thing as a Mass that began after 12:00 noon in any Catholic church in the world? Since everyone had to fast from midnight until he or she received Holy Communion, it was Church law that Masses could only be celebrated in the morning. The Communion fast was reduced to three hours and then to one hour in the 1960s, and sometime between 1968 and 1970 the first regular evening Masses on Saturday appeared in the calendars of our parishes. Before 1969, there could be no “anticipated” Mass. I firmly believe that the tradition of “Midnight Mass” for Christmas sprang up because people wanted to begin the Christmas Mass as early as possible on Christmas Day, but were absolutely prevented from beginning it before the clock struck twelve. Since it always began at 12:00, people called that particular liturgy “Midnight Mass.” Now that it’s no longer necessary to wait until 12:00 to begin it, we have the amusing situation of people calling to ask, “When is Midnight Mass?” and hearing the answer, “Ten o’clock.” But the truth is that the Church officially calls the first Mass of Christmas the *Missa in Nocte*, or “Mass at Night.”

As this issue of the bulletin will be distributed on both Holy Family Sunday and Epiphany, which takes us over the bridge between the old calendar year and the new, it seems natural to consider the idea of time. This is a time of year for weighing whether we use time well or poorly, and a time for resolving to make whatever changes we deem necessary to follow Christ more closely. It’s fitting, then, that our change of the calendar year comes in the season of the Lord’s birth, on the octave day of Christmas, January 1.

I once read an article that has me contemplating the uniqueness of the Christian understanding of time. These days a person is often considered a deep thinker if he or she believes the universe is full of great cycles. Some people see patterns in events, and this can seem

intriguing. The fact is almost all people once saw time as occurring in cycles. This is probably because patterns are present everywhere in our physical world: the coming of night and day, the waxing and waning of the moon, the circuit of the stars, the progression of the seasons – things as different as the human body and eclipses of the sun and moon all have discernible patterns. No wonder people began to think that was the way time was: cyclic. Almost all peoples and belief systems saw events as recurring, and today, that belief might seem fresh and new when in fact, it is quite old. It was replaced by a different understanding, a Judeo-Christian understanding: time is linear.

It’s appropriate for us to consider these things at Christmastime because of what we are commemorating. God made himself known to his people at a moment in time. He made covenants with them, and he promised them that they would be his own people. He sent them his prophets, who told the people that a savior was coming. And at a particular moment in time, God sent his angel to a virgin of Nazareth named Mary to announce that she would become the mother of the Redeemer. At the moment of her consent, the Son of God was conceived in her womb and that unborn child was both God and man. The fact of the Incarnation became visible to the world in the birth of Jesus at Bethlehem, as the promised Savior was born in time. The birth of Christ was a singular event, never to be repeated. The sacrifice that Jesus made at Calvary when he hung upon the Cross was once for all. His resurrection from the dead made it possible for us to have eternal life. These events mark God’s definitive intervention in human history. We can be filled with wonder at this fact! God did not remain at a distance from the people he so loved; he came among us as one of us.

Let’s never take for granted this earthly life of ours. After all, it was in this life, at a moment in human history, that God intervened to make us his own sons and daughters! I am thankful that as Christians we do not look at the universe as an endlessly repeating set of cycles. We are in a progression, moving ever closer to eternal life with God. May he bless you and fill you with grace in the New Year.
