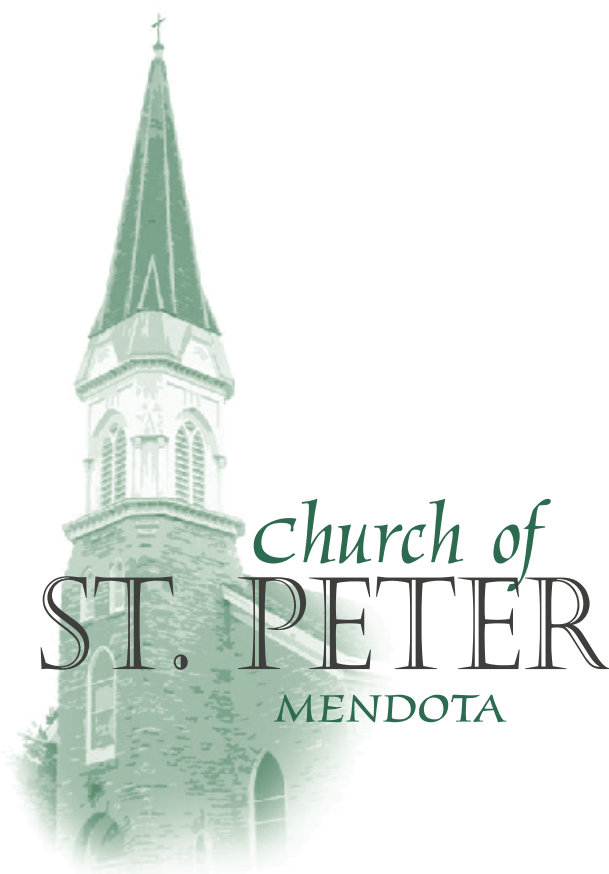

From the Pastor's Desk

Tomorrow (Monday, July 22), Pope Francis will arrive in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil for the 28th World Youth Day. It looks as though his schedule after arriving in South America includes an open day, during which I expect he will rest after the long flight. But the next day (July 24) he will journey to the Shrine of Our Lady of the Conception at Aparecida, Brazil for Mass in the basilica, and then will return to Rio for a visit to a hospital. All of this will be before the official World Youth Day events take place.

The idea of this multi-day faith event for the young and the adults who accompany them came from Blessed John Paul II, who proclaimed the first World Youth Day (WYD) in 1986. The usual pattern is a large event in the Diocese of Rome one year, and a major international assembly the next year. The international WYDs have been in Buenos Aires, Argentina (1987); Santiago de Compostela, Spain (1989); Czestochowa, Poland (1991); Manila, Philippines (1995); Paris (1997); Rome (2000); Toronto (2002); Cologne, Germany (2005); Sydney, Australia (2008); and Madrid (2011). You might recall the first World Youth Day in the United States was the one in Denver in 1993 – an event that caused people to marvel at how the vast crowds of youth who had come together for a holy purpose prompted an almost complete cessation of crime in the Denver area for the duration of the assembly. World Youth Day is said to have transformed the Archdiocese of Denver in the succeeding years. But it certainly transforms the hearts of those who participate.

Many people from our own Archdiocese have embarked on the long journey to South America to be part of WYD. Thursday, July 25 will feature the official welcome ceremony on the Copacabana waterfront in Rio de Janeiro (a Southern Hemisphere city that has warm temperatures even in winter), and on Friday the Way of the Cross will be observed at the same location. On Saturday the Holy Father will celebrate Mass with the bishops and priests who have traveled to Brazil for the events, and later will meet with civic leaders. That evening the young people, having left the hundreds of different locations at which they will have been staying, will make their way to the *Campus Fidei* (the “Field of Faith”) in time for a prayer vigil with the Holy Father. I expect few of them will sleep much that night, and then the actual World Youth Day (Sunday, July 28) will dawn. Pope Francis will celebrate Mass there in the *Campus Fidei* in this *Annus Fidei* (Year of Faith) that we are all observing. Let’s pray that the hearts of those hundreds of thousands of youth will be open to hearing God speak to them at the World Youth Day celebrations. The Pope will board a plane for Rome that same day, but many of the young people and other adults will make their way back to their homes only after taking in more of the sights of Rio de Janeiro, having traveled a long way to be there with our new Holy Father.

Today marks the beginning of Natural Family Planning Awareness Week. July 25 (the Feast of St. James the Apostle) was the date in 1968 on which Pope Paul VI published the encyclical letter *Humanae Vitae*, which upheld the traditional teaching of the Catholic Church about the immorality of birth control. It is a challenge to accept and live out the Catholic view of chastity, especially in a world that constantly tells us that the gift of sexuality is merely a means of recreation. It can also be very difficult for many husbands and wives of good will who are quite concerned about their ability to welcome more children. I encourage you to visit the website of the Archdiocese and find a series of prayers for nine days (a novena) to be used to ask God for a rebirth of chastity and purity: <http://www.archspm.org/uls/resources/NFP-Novena-for-Rebirth-of-Chastity-Purity-2013.pdf>. To give you an idea of how beautiful these prayers are, I want to include this excerpt for July 22, the Memorial of St. Mary Magdalene:

For all who work in entertainment and the arts

Lord, God, we ask you today to send forth in great abundance, through your Mother’s Most Immaculate and Pure Heart, the graces needed to convert and change the hearts of all those who work in the entertainment industry and in the arts. Grant them the gift to see the true beauty and dignity of the human person and thus create accordingly. Let them always place the virtue of chastity and purity at the forefront of their creations. Through the intercession of St. Mary Magdalene, may all writers, producers, artists, musicians and poets come to love you just as much as this holy woman did. Free from the bonds of slavery all those addicted to pornography and all those involved in prostitution. ...

I hope you can see how moving the words of this novena are!

The word on the street was always that Pope Benedict had been working on an encyclical letter at the time he decided to renounce the papacy. On June 29, Pope Francis published his first encyclical letter, which is known, as Church documents are, by its first words in the Latin language: *Lumen Fidei*. Those words mean “The Light of Faith.” The Vatican has taken the unusual step of announcing that the letter is the work of two popes: Pope Francis took the work of Pope Benedict and made the words his own by changing the style a bit. So in this Year of Faith we have an encyclical on faith. It is 25 pages long when I printed it out in the parish office. I am looking forward to reading it and sharing some of the content with you.

May God bless you as we all enjoy these summer days!

Stewardship Spotlight Historic Church Tours

As the oldest Catholic parish in Minnesota, Saint Peter's is gifted with an historical heritage unlike any other Catholic church in the state. In an effort to share our history with parishioners and others in the area, we offer Historic Church tours by appointment and every Sunday during the summer. We have a dedicated group of volunteers who give these tours. Pauline Legendre has been conducting Historic Church tours for 31 years, and can recall how her now-grown son crawled up the aisles of the church as she gave tours! Pauline got involved in this effort because she loves history. Her favorite part about conducting the tours is the people she meets—both people who come in for the tours and other fellow tour guides. Conducting tours can be quite quick, as some people simply poke their head in the church to take a look and maybe ask a question, while others are a rapt audience listening carefully to all of the historic facts. One common question from tourists: who are the statues of in the church?

People come for tours for many reasons. Some may have attended St. Peter's school and come back to visit. Others have heard about the church through other historical sites like the Sibley House. And sometimes a tour bus or two comes through as a part of an organized tour of interesting sites in the Twin Cities.

Pauline encourages others to get involved in this effort, saying, "It's fun to meet new people and share St. Peter's history!" There is a booklet available on the history of the church that gives you all the details you need to conduct the tours. 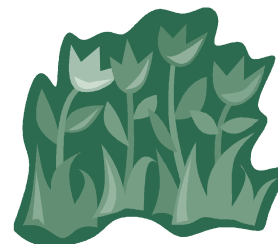
